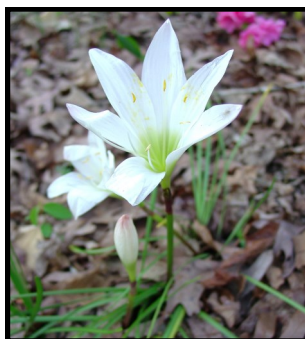

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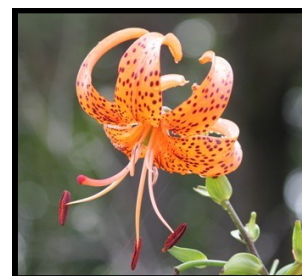
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There are a number of active chapters in the state. Contact information for individuals in local organizations is located on the back of this sheet.
